



### The Last 125 Years

- 1868 Alderman Cropper set up the Nottingham Institute for the Deaf and ran Bible classes in sign language from his own home.
- 1890 Mr Greaves, who was deaf himself, took over and re-organised the Institute, which became the Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Adult Deaf Society.
- 1930 The Executive Committee bought the old Paton Cottage buildings on Forest Road West and the Grand Opening took place on January 29th 1931.
- 1935 The Society's reach was extended to include deafened people and the hard of hearing.
- **1948** The Society became a registered charity under the National Assistance Act.
- 1954 The charity agreed with Nottinghamshire County Council to work as a Welfare Agency, helping people throughout the county.





- 1956 First Social Workers for the deaf were employed.
- **1975** The first BSL classes for hearing people were run.
- the Deaf, and the constitution was updated.
